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## CAREER CHALLENGE DAY

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### Hands-On Activity Kit Selection

*You will receive one hands-on activity kit that corresponds to a RTCC program. Please rank the following kit descriptions in your order of preference from 1 to 5 (1 = most preferred, 5 = least preferred). There are a limited number of each activity kit, and we will do our best to give everyone an activity kit they want.*

- \_\_\_\_\_ **Advanced Manufacturing:** Learn about the manufacturing process! In this activity, participants will create a product working as a team using the design cycle and sketching. Then, participants will create computer models of the products on RTCC's CAD platform: SolidWorks. After the computer models are created, participants will use them to create CNC programs with Cura and LaserWorks. Parts will be created on our Laser cutter and 3D printed on one of our 3D printers. Meanwhile, participants will document their progress with sketches, pictures and videos.
  
- \_\_\_\_\_ **Construction Trades & Management:** Build a mini table top Jenga set with the Construction Trades & Management hands-on activity kit, which includes small pieces of sanded wood identifying each species: butternut, cherry, maple, and beech, among others. Every year Construction Trades & Management students are involved in a contracting project as well as units on furniture, crafts, timber framing, and a program-related technology project of their choice. Construction Trades & Management links to careers such as carpentry, civil engineering, building inspection, tiling, painting, electrical wiring, kitchen design, and more.
  
- \_\_\_\_\_ **Criminal Justice/Cybersecurity:** Spend the virtual day with us to begin your journey in the exciting and fast-paced world of criminal justice and cyber security. Find out if a career in investigations, policing, national security or military service is right for you!
  
- \_\_\_\_\_ **Diversified Agriculture:** Plant and grow micro-greens at home using the Diversified Agriculture hands-on activity kit, which includes potting soil, a tray, & seeds. Micro greens are consumable, and are a much hardier and quick growing option than flowers or other plants. In the Diversified Agriculture program, students learn what it takes to be successful in agriculture in Vermont, learning plant, soil, and animal sciences through hands on learning in our greenhouse and farm operation and working with local farmers.
  
- \_\_\_\_\_ **Electrical Technology:** Build a light bucket with the Electrical Technology hands-on activity kit! The kit includes a plastic octagon boxes, five gallon buckets with lid, a cord and a colored fluorescent light bulb. These light buckets are fun to use at campsites, in your backyard, or on your porch.
